He was returning to the land his father, Capt. Robert Kirkwood, had received in 1789. Kirkwood House is on the National Register and it is hoped the entire community will be placed on the list.

**Sedgwick House Museum** 627 Hanover St. (Rt. 7, Hanover St. exit) Contains materials pertaining to the area in and surrounding Martins Ferry. The town had its inception in 1787 when the ground upon which the city is located was purchased by Captain Absalom Martin, one of the surveyors of the Seven Ranges of the Northwest Territory. Absalom started operating a ferry in 1789. Thus the name Martins Ferry. In 1835, his son, Ebenezer, platted and laid out the town. Open by appointment. 740-633-3430, 740-859-3013 . Admission.

**Walnut Grove Cemetery** (Rt. 7 north, Hanover St. exit, north on Fourth St.) Dating from 1795, the cemetery is Martins Ferry's oldest pioneer landmark. It is the resting place of the Zane and Martin families. The Betty Zane Statue is a reminder of the heroine of the last battle of Fort Henry.

## MORRISTOWN 43759

**National Register of Historic Places.** The village of Morristown was platted in 1802 and is considered one of the best preserved examples of a National Pike Town. Its historic homes and buildings date from the early to mid 1800s and feature some of the more common architectural styles found along the National Road, the nation's first federally-funded highway. **Dysart Woods** (I-70 Exit 208 to Rt. 149 south to Belmont, then Rt. 147 south to Dysart—approx. 9 miles from I-70 exit) The largest known (51 acres) of unglaciated, primeval oak forest in Southeastern Ohio. The virgin forest, with specimens 300-400 years old, is a National Natural Landmark and botanical research laboratory of Ohio University and the Eastern Campus. Follow the foot paths (no restrooms).

**Piedmont Lake** 740-658-3735 at the marina. I-70 Exit 202 to Rt. 800 North, at Marina Rd. One mile northeast of Smyrna in the northwest corner of Belmont County. Marina near the tri-county corner. The 2,270 acre lake, with a shoreline of 38 miles, is administered by the Muskingum Watershed Conservancy District.

## HISTORICAL SITES

**The Shaeffer/Campbell Covered Bridge** stands east of the Ohio University Eastern Campus, I-70 Exit 213, overlooking a pond. It was originally built in 1891 in Fairfield County. Rescued from destruction in the late 1960's, it was reconstructed on the present site in 1975.

**Ohio Bicentennial Barn** in Belmont County is one of the 88 painted in each of Ohio's counties. Scott Hagan of Jerusalem, Ohio painted all 88 barns. This one is located off I-70 Exit 208, go south on Rt. 149. The white barn is on private property on the left side of Rt. 149, prior to the entrance to Barkcamp State Park.

**Mail Pouch Barn** in Barkcamp State Park, painted by deceased barn painter Harley Warrick of Belmont, Ohio. This is one of many barns on which Harley left his mark. Harley estimated he traveled 50,000+ miles a year as a Mail Pouch painter before he retired. He was featured in People Magazine, Smithsonian and the Wall Street Journal. Warrick painted by eye, starting at the center with the “e” in chew.

## OHIO BYWAYS

Belmont County is the only county in the state with a total of three official Ohio Byways: the Drovers' Trail along Ohio 147 and 800, Historic National Road, and the Ohio River Scenic Byway along Ohio 7.

**Drovers' Trail** is an old cattleman's trail where livestock were herded to commercial boats on the Ohio River located just south of the National Rd. in eastern Ohio's hill country. Extending from Exit 202 on I-70 Hendrysburg in Belmont Cty, south along St. Rt. 147 to the Ohio River city of Bellaire, Drovers' Trail links the National Rd. and Ohio River Scenic Byways. **Historic National Road** has been designated an All-American Road by the Federal Highway Administration, which administers the National Scenic Byways Program.
